Expanding the Song!

- **A central tenet in Judaism is that we were all present at Har Sinai when the ten commandments were given to the Jewish people, and that we should live each day as though we are yet again receiving the wonder of the ten commandments.**
- **This song approaches that experience through our senses, asking the question, “What did it feel like to be there? What did it sound like, what did it smell like, what could we see on that day?”**
- **Teach the Call and Response: *Im Moshe u’Vnei’ Yisrael* and discuss**
